**GEORGE W. PAYNE IS DEAD;
 VETERAN BUSINESS MAN**

George W. Payne, 74, operator of a barber and beauty shop in the Grand Rapids Trust Co. building and well-known business man for 30 years, died early Monday at the

residence of a son-in-law and daughter, Dr. and Mrs. Willis L. Dixon, 1324 Thomas-st., S. E. Payne resided at 1304 Sherman-st., S. E., where he had been ill five weeks.

Payne formerly operated the Morton hotel barber shop 15 years and took charge of the Trust building shop when that building was opened nine years ago. He had resided here 35 years and was a member of Westminster Presbyterian church and the Knights of Pythias.

Besides the daughter, he leaves his widow, Lottie; another daughter, Mrs. G. L. Trunkler of Cincinnati, Ohio, and three grandchildren. The body will be taken from the Colonial home to the late residence on Sherman-st., S. E., Tuesday morning.

Funeral services will be held at 2:30 Wednesday at the home, Rev. Edward P. Downey, pastor of Westminster Presbyterian church, officiating. Burial will be in Woodlawn cemetery.
